Thirteen hawkwatch sites reported counts for autumn 2002 (Table 1). No official count was conducted this year at Sterrett's Gap, in Perry County, or at Council Cup, in Luzerne County, a site that has suspended activity for the indefinite future. Count hours ranged from 138 to 1,127 hours, for a total of 7,809 hours, and count days ranged from 22 to 131 days (including January at Hawk Mountain) for a total of 1,082 days. An overall total of 150,354 raptors representing 18 species was reported. Swainson's Hawks (Buteo swainsoni) were observed at two sites, Little Gap (Northampton County) and Second Mountain (Lebanon County), as were Mountain (Lebanon County), as were Mississippi Kites (Ictinia mississippiensis), at Hawk Mountain Sanctuary (Berks County) and Rocky Ridge (York County). Eleven sites posted daily results to the BirdSource Autumn Hawkwatch website (http://entry.birdsource.org/HawkWat chDataEntry/), RaptorsOnline (http://raptorsonline.org/), or the HMANA Birdhawk listserv.

Average count effort (hours of observation) per watchsite in 2002 decreased slightly from 2001 (601 hours/site vs. 636 hours/site), with the largest decreases at Brady's Bend (Clarion County) (-34%), Second Mountain (-25%), and Tuscarora Summit (Fulton County) (-21%). Only Stone Mountain (Huntington County) logged more total hours this year, and only three sites logged more than 800 hours [Hawk Mountain, Wagoner Gap (Cumberland County), Second Mountain]. A high number of rainy and foggy October days appears to have affected count effort at almost every site, with fewer days and hours this October than in the previous three October.

Composition of the flight

In autumn 2002, peak counts of

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Peregrine Falcons (Falco peregrinus) were synchronous among watchsites (Table 2), centering on 5 October. Daily flights of more than twenty peregrines are rarely recorded away from coastal or Great Lakes watchsite, however four Pennsylvania sites (all of which set season-record counts) exceeded this mark last fall, and several other watchsite in the Northeast and mid-Atlantic states also counted above average numbers of peregrines on 5 October. Most watchsite also experienced a higher than average flight of Bald Eagles (Haliaeetus leucocephalus), continuing a trend over the last several years, with season records at five sites. After lower than average counts of Broad-winged Hawks (Buteo platypterus) last year, many sites reported higher counts this year, possibly because the birds stayed closer to the ridges this year than in recent years, when watchsite to our east reported the bulk of the flight passing them.

The four most numerous migrants this year were Broad-winged Hawks, Red-tailed Hawks (*Buteo jamaicensis*), Sharp-shinned Hawks (*Accipiter* striatus), and Turkey Vultures (*Cathartes aura*) (Table 3). Broadwings made up the largest percentage of the overall flight at 55% (range 22-80%). Red-tailed Hawks (15% overall), ranged from 3% at Militia Hill (Montgomery County) to 30% at Stone Mountain. Sharp-shinned Hawks (14% overall) ranged from 6% at Jack's Mountain (Mifflin County) to 24% at Rose Tree Park (Delaware County), and Turkey Vultures (4% overall) ranged from 1% at Hawk Mountain to 22% at Brady's Bend.

Only two of the remaining twelve regular migrants, Ospreys (*Pandion* haliaetus) (at 3%) and Cooper's Hawks (Accipiter cooperil) (at 2%) made up 2% or more of the overall flight. Compared to last year, overall passage rates (birds per hour) increased greatly for Peregrine Falcons (+25%), Bald Eagles (+36%), Ospreys (+35%), and Broadwinged Hawks (+210%), and decreased for Sharp-shinned Hawks (-20%) (Table 3). Passage rates for all other species (Black Vulture (Coragyps atratus), Turkey Vulture, Northern Harrier (Circus cyaneus), Cooper's Hawk, Red-shouldered Hawk (Buteo lineatus), Red-tailed Hawk, Roughlegged Hawk (Buteo lagopus), Golden Eagle (Aquila chrysaetos), American Kestrel (Falco sparverius), and Merlin (F. columbarius)] fluctuated by less than 20% from 2001. The irruptive Northern Goshawk (Accipiter gentilis) was off by -43%. Several watchsite experienced well-below average counts of Northern Harriers.

Seasonal highlights

Allegheny Front (Bedford County) -Observation effort decreased more than 100 hours compared to 2001, however new season records were established for Ospreys (119), Bald Eagles (64), Broad-winged Hawks (3,766), American Kestrels (101), Peregrine Falcons (52), and total raptors (9,743). Nearly half of the kestrel flight was seen in a single day, October 6, when 47 were counted. During the week of October 18-24, observers counted one-third of the total Red-tailed Hawk flight. Passage rates for most species, all but Northern Goshawk, Rough-legged Hawk, Golden Eagle (which dropped 40% from last season, a record count year), and Merlin were equal to or greater than last year.

Bake Oven Knob (Lehigh County) -Season records were established for Ospreys (794; peak count 116 on September 14) and Peregrine Falcons (63; 25 on October 5). The 80 Merlins counted (26 on October 5) is the second highest season total after last year's record of 102. This is a species seen in increasing numbers across the state. Other species passing at rates above the short-term average were Black Vultures, Turkey Vultures, Bald Eagles, Broad-winged Hawks, and Golden Eagles. Northern Harriers, Sharp-shinned Hawks, Red-shouldered Hawks, Red-tailed Hawks, and American Kestrel were below shortterm averages.

Brady's Bend (Clarion County) -Count effort decreased for the second straight year, with subsequent declines in overall count numbers and passage rate. However, passage rates for some species, including Bald Eagles, Sharpshinned Hawks, Cooper's Hawks, and Broad-winged Hawks were higher than in 2001. Hawk Mountain Sanctuary (Berks County) - Season records were set for Bald Eagle (207) and Peregrine Falcon (62) during the August 15 to December 15 count period. A new single day record of 31 Peregrine Falcons was seen on 5 October. The previous record was 11 peregrines on 7 October 1937. Overall, the total raptor count was 20% higher than the 10-year average. Above ten-year average counts were reported for Broad-winged Hawks, Golden Eagle (122; 2nd highest on record), and Ospreys. Below ten-year average counts were reported for Northern Harriers, American Kestrels and all Accipiter hawks. The Sanctuary's first-ever fall sighting of Mississippi Kite was reported on October 8. Volunteers counted 27 southbound Bald Eagles during 14 days of observation in January.

Jack's Mountain (Mifflin County) - A season record flight of Broad-winged Hawks (6,844, with 2,900 on September 18) made up 75% of the total raptor count, the site's secondhighest total count in 8 years of reporting. The overall passage rate without the Broad-wingeds was 5.3 birds per hour, the lowest since 1994. Other above average species counts included those for Turkey Vultures, Bald Eagles, and Golden Eagles. Observers counted 148 and 120 Turkey Vultures on October 15 and 17, respectively. A season high 9 Northern Harriers was seen on September 18.

Little Gap (Northampton County) -Season records were set for Broadwinged Hawks (11,891), Peregrine Falcons (49; previous record 39 set in 1990), and Ospreys (630; peak count 71 on September 14) and this was the second-best year for total migrants (20,346). Peak broadwing days occurred September 18-20 and 23 with counts of 1,332; 4,259; 2,423; and 1,304 respectively. The site reported the highest overall passage rates in the state both with (30.5 birds per hour), and without broadwings (12.7 birds per hour). Peak counts of 23 Bald Eagles on September 17 and 21 Peregrines on October 5 both were single-day records. The site's sixth Swainson's Hawk was seen on October 20, and a late Osprey was seen on November 30.

Militia Hill (Montgomery County) -The peak flight day on September 24 of 7,021 total hawks accounted for 60% of the season count total, and included 6,948 Broad-winged Hawks, the 4th highest one-day count on record. Eighty-one Black Vultures, a season record, were counted. In 1999, the count period was defined as September and October only. With little variation in observation hours and coverage since then, passage rates (birds/hour) have decreased each year for Osprey, Northern Harrier, Sharp-shinned Hawk, Red-shouldered Hawk, American Kestrel, Merlin, and Peregrine Falcon. All other species were about average this year except that both species of vultures were seen at above average rates.

Rocky Ridge (York County) - One of two sites reporting a Mississippi Kite in 2002, the first-ever record of this species at the site. Randy Phillips, compiler, notes that Aan adult Mississippi Kite [was] observed by many on October 6.@ This was an overall average year for the site, with above-average numbers of Turkey Vulture, Bald Eagle, Cooper's Hawk (including a record season count of 56), Red-tailed Hawk, and Peregrine Falcon, and below-average numbers of Northern Harrier and Broad-winged Hawks. Flights of the latter species may have been missed because of incomplete coverage. A Rough-legged Hawk was seen November 3, the first reported for Rocky Ridge since 1999.

Rose Tree Park (Delaware County) -New season records were set for Turkey Vulture (689; peak count 117 on October 31), Black Vulture (94; 13 on October 21), Bald Eagle (155; 9 on September 24), and Cooper's Hawk (236; 25 on October 20). Bald Eagles were seen on 57% of all count days. The Peregrine Falcon season record of 19 was tied. Count effort decreased by 12% over last year's high of 686 hours. Passage rates for most species were equal to or greater than in 2001, except for Northern Goshawk, Golden Eagle, American Kestrel, and Merlin.

Second Mountain (Lebanon County) - The eleventh site record of a Swainson's Hawk was seen on October 3. A peak flight of 5,367 Broad-winged Hawks on September 20 contributed to a new season record of 8,076. Hours of observation were down from last year, the lowest since 1997, but still aboveaverage compared to all other watchsite. After a 2001 record of 104 Northern Goshawks observers counted 55 in 2002. Nearly 70% of the Turkey Vultures were counted between 3 and 13November. The 20 Peregrine Falcons counted was the lowest since 1995.

Stone Mountain (Huntingdon County) - Observers logged a season record 425 hours, and season record were set for Cooper's Hawks (309; peak count of 38 on October 5), Broadwinged Hawks (1,890; 1,135 on September 18), Merlins (68; 18 on October 5), Peregrine Falcons (47; 22 on October 5) and total migrants (5,651). At least one Golden Eagle was seen on 59% of the count days in October and November. This is the only watchsite at which Golden Eagles made up more than 1% of the total count.

Tuscarora Summit (Fulton County) -Twelve Golden Eagles on November 25 helped set a season record of 55. The Bald Eagle season record was tied at 31 (peak count 6 on September 18). New records were also set for Black Vulture (46) and Turkey Vulture (442). Observation effort was the third lowest in thirty years of counts. Ospreys, Bald Eagles, Cooper's Hawks, Broad-winged Hawks, Golden Eagles, and Peregrine Falcons were seen at above average rates. Passage rates were below average for Northern Harriers, Sharpshinned Hawks, and Northern Goshawks.

Waggoner's Gap (Cumberland County) - Peak counts on 5-6 October of 17 and 13 Merlins contributed to a season record of 98, and 187 Bald Eagles also sets a new season record over 149 seen in 2001. The Broadwinged Hawk flight was highlighted by the count of 5,305 on 20 September, the highest ever single-day count (previously 4,827 on 21 September 1987). The peak counts of Golden Eagles occurred 27 October (27 birds, a single day count record) and 28 October (18 birds). Forty-one percent of the Red-shouldered Hawks were counted in the 10 days between 28 October and 7 November.
