Sept 4, 1950: 48 bald eagles in one day

Sept 14, 1978: 21,448 broad-winged hawk counted on what is known as the "Miracle Day" count

October 8, 1979: 2,475 sharp-shinned hawks in one day, the peak count in 85 years

October 8, 1992: A sharp-shinned hawk passes North Lookout to become the millionth recorded raptor

October 3, 2002: A one-day high of 31 peregrine falcons counted

November 2, 2012: 48 golden eagles passed by North Lookout

2018: A record 546 bald eagles counted during the official season
