Weather can make or break a hawk watch season. In autumn 2009 a strengthening El Nino disrupted autumn weather, particularly during November. Precipitation and temperatures were above-average (Northeast Regional Climate Center, <www.nrcc.cornell.edu>), with October unusually wet and November turning out to be one of the warmest on record across the northeast, as well as the fifth warmest for Pennsylvania since 1895. Snowfall was nonexistent through most of New England until mid-December and this, along with the warmth, may have prompted lateseason migrants-for example Redtailed Hawks and Rough-legged Hawks-to linger farther north than usual. November also included periods of strong easterly winds that appear to have pushed some migrants farther west than usual.

Despite the weather, Pennsylvania's fourteen autumn hawkwatches recorded an impressive 117,824 hawks of 19 species between 1 Aug and 31 Dec (Table 2). Rarities included one Swallow-tailed Kite (Militia Hill, adult), four Mississippi Kites (one immature, one adult, 2 unknown age), and one Swainson's Hawk (Rose Tree Park, juvenile, light morph). The four Mississippi Kites were seen on different days across the state and likely represent different birds. Autumn sightings of this species have increased due to the expanding eastern populations (now breeding in Connecticut and New Hampshire). McWilliams and Brauning (2000) report only one autumn sighting prior to 2000, that in October 1989, whereas
autumn hawkwatches have tallied one to four per year since 2000. Pennsylvania watch-sites may soon need to add this species as a regular migrant!

Counters covered a combined total of 7370 hours and 1132 days, with individual site coverage ranging from 48 to 1136 hours and 9 to 140 days per site. The average passage rate was 16 birds per hour statewide, a slight increase compared with 2008's 14.5 birds per hour, although effort was slightly lower as well (Table 2).

Species showing an increase in 2009 compared with 2008 included Northern Goshawk (36\%), Sharpshinned Hawk (28\%), Cooper's Hawk (23.7\%), Bald Eagle (10.6\%), Broadwinged Hawk (5\%), American Kestrel (39\%), Merlin (12\%), and Peregrine Falcon (30\%). Decreases were seen for Rough-legged Hawk (63\%), Golden Eagle (24\%), and Black Vulture (16\%). Other species' totals showed less than $5 \%$ change between years.

Bald Eagles continued their upswing with four watch-sites (Allegheny Front, Militia Hill, Stone Mountain, and Waggoner's Gap) setting new season records, and most remaining sites showing above-average counts (Table 2). Two sites, Hawk Mountain and Militia Hill, set new season records for Peregrine Falcon, and most sites showed noteworthy oneday counts as well (Table 1, 2). 10 October was "Peregrine Falcon day" for the Kittatinny Ridge, when Bake Oven Knob, Little Gap, and Hawk Mountain saw 8, 9, and 11 Peregrines respectively. Stone Mountain also set a new season record (325) for Turkey

## Vultures.

Broad-winged Hawks moved in large numbers through the southeastern Piedmont and along the northern ridges. Higher than average counts were recorded at Militia Hill, Buckingham, and Rose Tree Park in the southeast, and at Stone and Second Mountains north of the Kittatinny (Table 2). Waggoner's Gap reported that a low fog-bank blanketed the ridge and may have kept them from spotting broad-wings on their peak day when birders in the valley were seeing many flocks nearby (Table 1). Southeastern sites observe their largest flight on the 19 and 20 September, with 7525 at Militia Hill on 19 September and 2577 at Buckingham on 20 September, together representing the state's highest one-day counts for 2009 (Table $1)$. The ridge-migrating birds moved slightly earlier, with 1396 at Stone Mountain on 16 September and 1477 at Second Mountain on 17 September. Most other Kittatinny sites reported their peak Broad-winged Hawk flight on 17 September as well, suggesting that a widespread pulse of migrants moved though Pennsylvania on that date (Table 1).

Despite the frequent rain, October included several days of strong northwest winds, which brought respectable accipiter flights to the ridges. Route 183 and Waggoner's Gap recorded the state's highest one-day count of Sharp-shinned Hawks with 665 and 742 respectively, both on 10 October. Little Gap was a close third with 571 on 8 October (Table 1). Overall Sharp-shinned Hawk counts were higher than in 2008, but average

compared to longterm totals.

November's brisk east winds appear to have pushed Golden Eagles to the west central region. Both Allegheny Front and Tuscarora Summit tallied aboveaverage season counts. Allegheny Front recorded 59 eagles in a two-day period, including the state one-day high count of 30 on 12

November. Stone Mountain tallied 22 Golden Eagles on 3 November and was the only other watch site not to record below-average counts for this species (Table 1, 2).

Allegheny Front (Somerset/Bedford) - Allegheny Front recorded 6237 hawks in 113 days of coverage from 15 August to 18 December, averaging 8.5 birds per hour (Table 1). The total count was $30 \%$ below-average primarily due to low counts of Broadwinged, Sharp-shinned, and Red-tailed hawks. Record counts were made for Bald Eagle (103), and above-average counts were tallied for Golden Eagles (204). The latter tally was the highest of any watch site in the eastern United States. The site's highest one-day tally occurred 18 September with 763 total hawks including 710 Broad-winged Hawks.

Bake Oven Knob (Lehigh) - Bake Oven Knob recorded a below-average total (down $27 \%$ ) of 11,066 hawks in 106 days of coverage from 14 August through 29 November (Table 2). Highlights included above-average tallies for Black Vulture, Turkey Vulture, Bald Eagle, American Kestrel, Merlin, and Peregrine Falcon, and two. sightings of Mississippi Kite on 23 August and 9 September. Both Turkey Vulture and Peregrine Falcon totals were the second highest ever recorded at this long-running site (Table 2).

Blue Mountain/Route 183 (Berks/Schuylkill) - Blue Mountain tallied 4415 hawks with increased coverage in 2009 spanning from 15 August to 28 November. Visitation also increased in 2009 providing more spotting assistance than in past years. One of the highlights of the season was 10 October when counters tallied 12 species including 665 Sharp-shinned Hawks, 44 Cooper's Hawks, 29 American Kestrels, 27 Red-tailed Hawks, 4 Bald Eagles, and 4 Peregrine Falcons.

Buckingham-BWSEPT (Bucks) - Two BroadwingSEPT sites, Buckingham and Pipersville, conducted counts in 2009, although Pipersville counted only 15 September totaling 20 hawks. Buckingham tallied the state's second highest one-day count of Broad-winged Hawks (2577) 20 September. The total count, 5827 , was $49 \%$ above average, recorded primarily in two days, 19 and 20 September. During the nine days of
counts, watchers also tallied 18 Bald Eagles, 48 Osprey, and one Mississippi Kite.
Council Cup (Luzerne) - Council Cup sighted 626 hawks in 22 days of coverage from 18 August to 4 November, during a lower than average 22 days of effort (Table 2). Totals included 226 Red-tailed Hawks and 105 Broad-winged Hawks. The peak flight occurred on 24 September with 38 Broad-winged Hawks, 33 Sharpshinned Hawks, and 7 Bald Eagles, for a total of 95 migrants. In another encouraging sign, the Bald Eagle season total of 37 was well above the season average despite lower hours of coverage (Table 2).

## Hawk Mountain Sanctuary

 (Berks/Schuylkill) - Hawk Mountain registered 15,600 hawks in 126 days of counts, $14 \%$ below the recent 10 -year average. Eight species showed belowaverage counts. Turkey Vulture and Merlin counts were above average (Table 2). The site set new season records for Black Vulture (154) and Peregrine Falcon (68). The falcon count included 11 on 10 October, the highest one-day count for the state. Lateseason migrants were particularly low in 2009. For the first time since 1955 , Hawk Mountain recorded no Roughlegged Hawks. The Golden Eagle count was $35 \%$ below-average and the Redtailed Hawks were $46 \%$ below average. Several observers watched an adult Mississippi Kite hawking for insects in the air along the ridge top 15 August.Jack's Mountain (Mifflin) - Jack's Mountain recorded 2642 hawks in 60 days of coverage from 18 August to 29 November (Table 2). Counts were lower than average for all but Bald Eagle, despite slightly increased coverage. The site tallied 44 Bald Eagles with a peak of nine on 21 September. The highest one-day count for the season was made on 20 September, with 423 Broadwinged Hawks, 21 Sharp-shinned Hawks, 6 Bald Eagles, and 6 Osprey.

Little Gap (Northampton) - Little Gap tallied 9091 hawks in 90 days of counts in 2009, $39 \%$ below the 10 -year average (Table 2). Merlin and Peregrine Falcons were above-average, with 82 and 38 respectively. Broad-winged Hawk and Red-tailed Hawk were $42 \%$ and $60 \%$ below average due to inclement weather during peak flight periods. October brought some
excitement with the second highest state-wide count of Peregrine Falcons, 9, that on 10 October (Table 1).
HAN Hill tallied SeqshQve-average count of $16,136 /$ Suss in 6 i人 (Table 2). An adult Swallow-tailed Kite was observed from late August to 5 September and allowed many birders excellent looks at this rarity. 19 September brought the third highest Broad-winged Hawk flight in the history of the site (7525), pushing the total Broad-winged Hawk for 2009 to an above-average 13,436 . New season records were set for Bald Eagle (86) and Peregrine Falcon (41). A new oneday record was set for Turkey Vulture (134) on 17 October.

## Rose Tree Park (Delaware) - Rose

 Tree Park counted 6877 hawks in 530 hours of coverage for a rate of 13 migrants per hour. Broad-winged Hawks represented the majority of the migrants with 4514 recorded equaling $66 \%$ of the flight. Bald Eagles soared past in above-average numbers (177), following an increasing trend seen across the state. A juvenile light-morph Swainson's Hawk passed over the site 25 September, the second year in a row for this rarity at Rose Tree. Most other species totals were below-average, possibly due to a drop in hours or the weather.Second Mountain (Lebanon) - Second Mountain tallied 8588 hawks in 843 hours and 140 days of counts. Species totals were above-average for Bald Eagle (118) and Broad-winged Hawk (4386), but were below-average for most other species (Table 2). Watchers counted the highest one-day count 17 September when 1477 Broad-winged Hawks swirled overhead. A one-day high count of 169 Sharp-shinned Hawks on 6 October and 6 Peregrine Falcons on 7 October were the midseason highlights (Table 1).

Stone Mountain (Huntington) - Stone Mountain, in its 15 th season, counted an above-average 5163 migrants in 322 hours of coverage. A new season record was set for Bald Eagle (69), and Black Vulture, Turkey Vulture, Broad-winged Hawk, and Peregrine Falcon showed above-average season totals (Table 2). A one-day count of 1396 Broad-winged Hawks 16 September set a new record for the species and brought the season total to 2873 . The site recorded 22

- Golden Eagles 3 November, for the second highest state one-day total. In contrast, the season count of Red-tailed Hawks was one of the lowest on record, 522.

Tuscarora Summit (Fulton) Tuscarora Summit increased their coverage $10 \%$ to tally 4346 hawks in 419 hours from 1 September to 22 November (Table 2). Counters were rewarded with above-average counts of Turkey Vulture, Bald Eagle, Sharpshinned Hawk, Cooper's Hawk, Redshouldered Hawk, and Golden Eagle. The peak one-day count of Broadwinged Hawks, 466, swirled past 20 September for a total of 535 hawks. Both Sharp-shinned and Cooper's hawks peaked 9 October with 168 and 10 counted respectively. A peak oneday count of 5 Golden Eagles was seen 4 November.

Waggoner's Gap (Cumberland) Waggoner's Gap counted 21,216 hawks in 1136 hours of coverage from 1 August through 31 December. Watchers set a new site record for Bald Eagles (405), a notable increase over the prior record count of 332 . Aboveaverage counts were tallied for Turkey Vulture, Sharp-shinned Hawk, and Merlin as well. Accipiter flights peaked 10 October with an impressive 726

Sharp-shinned and 106 Cooper's hawks, followed by 657 Sharp-shinned and 85 Cooper's on 11 October. 4 November brought the best Red-tailed Hawk daily counts for the state (526) among a total of 591 migrants. Golden Eagles were below-average with 182 total migrants and a peak count of 17 on 1 November (Table 2).
