APPALACHIAN ECOLOGY COURSE

June 16 through June 25, Hawk Mountain is offering a hands-on, immersive course experiencing and learning about the ecology of the Appalachians. 

Raptors...four days of just raptors! The goal of this workshop is to help you build confidence in your raptor field techniques. CAPTIVE RAPTOR MANAGEMENT WORKSHOP




