





Adopt a Bird of Prey Ambassador

With the help of the Raptor Ambassador Team, Hawk Mountain Sanctuary educates guests and communities about the importance of raptor conservation. The seven feathered educators live onsite and have been deemed non-releasable by a veterinarian and unable to survive in the wild. Each have an important role in engaging and educating the public on raptor conservation.



Why is raptor conservation education important?

- As top predators, they keep nature in balance and control pests.
- Raptors are bio-indicators for ecosystem health.
- Many raptor species are in decline. Their biggest threat are humans, which means we are also the solution.
- Our live bird of prey ambassadors connect people to Hawk Mountain Sanctuary raptor conservation and inspire people to take direct action.



What are the needs to successfully care for our education raptors?

- Daily nourishment of a specific diet according to their weight and custom-designed by its species is important for a healthy lifestyle.
- Behavioral enrichment provides environmental stimuli for optimal well-being.
- Daily husbandry provides the care needed for each bird.
- Regular and preventive veterinary care is important to their general health.
- Equipment, such as carriers, ensure safety during transportation and programs.
- Regular grooming and maintenance of their beaks and nails is important for a healthy lifestyle.
- Proper construction and maintenance of their enclosures ensure a safe space to reside in between education duties.
- Ongoing staff training is important to ensure that best practices and current methods are applied.



The Hawk Mountain Education Staff offers a variety of programs both onsite and offsite. Free programs are offered in the spring and fall, and an 8-week summer camp is offered for grades 1st-6th. In addition, an array of private programs, including a Mountain Discovery Hike, Raptors over the Ridge, Birds of Prey, or Virtual Programs are offered and tailored to each specific group.
